THIS CAUSE COMING ON TO BE HEARD and being heard by the undersigned Judge of the General Court of Justice, District Court Division, Wake County, Raleigh, North Carolina;

This is an action for an absolute divorce based on the grounds of one (1) Year's separation brought by the Plaintiff under the provision of North Carolina General Statutes  $\delta 50-6$  et seq. and proper and adequate service of the Complaint and Summons has been accomplished:

The Court, after hearing evidence from the Plaintiff, finds as fact:

- That the Plaintiff has been a resident of the State of North Carolina for more that six (6) months next preceding the commencement of this action.
- 2. That the Plaintiff and the Defendant were lawfully married to each other.
- 3. That the Plaintiff and the Defendant have lived separate and apart from each other continuously for more than one (1) year next preceding the commencement of this action.
- 4. That at the time the separation occurred, it was intended to be permanent.

Based on the Foregoing Findings of Fact, the Court concludes as Law that the Plaintiff is entitled to an absolute divorce.

IT IS NOW, THEREFORE, ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED that the bonds of matrimony heretofore existing between the Plaintiff and the Defendant be, and the same are hereby dissolved and the Plaintiff is granted an absolute divorce from the Defendant.
